

Euthanasia & Care of Remains

Humane euthanasia can be provided for your pet by a veterinarian. Our doctors can help you make the decision by providing medical advice and establishing a prognosis.

The euthanasia process is peaceful and humane. You can choose to be present for the euthanasia but do not have to stay if you would prefer not to. After your pet has passed you can spend as much time as you need to say goodbye.

The following options are offered for the care of your pets remains:

Private Cremation – Your pet will be cremated individually, and their cremains are returned in a pewter urn. Once the urn arrived back at our hospital, a staff member will call to inform you that they have arrived for you to pick up at your convenience.

Communal Cremation – Your pet will be cremated with other pets and their ashes are spread over the Sooke Hills.

Home Burial – You can take your pet home to bury in your yard instead of cremation. Please talk to our staff about how it can be done safely with no environmental impact.

A complimentary clay impression of your pets paw print can also be provided.
