Unusual Toxins

Here is a list of “unusual items” that you may not know are unsafe for your pets. If you think your pet has been exposed to something unsafe, please bring any packaging or photos to help the veterinary team.

Wild mushrooms – many mushrooms can be lethal to pets so be careful when walking and remove any mushrooms from your yard.

Blue-green algae – be mindful when taking your dog for a swim at some of the local lakes as blue-green algae can be fatal to dogs if consumed. Always read the notices that are posted at lakes to see if there is a warning.

Marijuana – dogs, and occasionally cats, can be exposed to marijuana in different forms in the home, at beaches and on the street. Although rarely fatal, pets can become disoriented and uncoordinated.

Xylitol – we are seeing more xylitol in products such as gum, vitamin supplements, peanut butter and toothpaste as people seek alternatives to sugar. Xylitol is not safe for pets to eat and can cause severe damage.
