

When should your pet be seen by your veterinarian?

- Any emergency situation (trauma, bleeding, respiratory difficulty, unable to urinate...)
- Abnormal breathing
- Weight loss or gain
- Drinking excessive amounts of water
- Urination accidents
- Frequent urination
- Eye discharge, frequent blinking, sensitivity to light
- Scooting the rear end along the ground
- Abnormal teeth or gums, bad breath
- Loss of appetite that persists over 24 hours
- Lethargy that persists over 24 hours
- Diarrhea or vomiting that persists over 24 hours
- Persistent drooling
- Any change in behavior which is hard to explain
- Hair loss (more than normal shedding)
- Any unusual discharge (eyes, ears, skin,...)
- Persistent cough
- A change in walking or running
- Pawing at ears, shaking head
- Constipated over 24 hours
